"Tomorrow marks your first day of TerraNova testing:

We are writing you this letter to remind you all that you are BRILLIANT, CREATIVE, and DETERMINED! Most importantly, you are all KIND, TRUSTWORTHY, and RESPECTFUL human beings that will grow up and make huge differences in our world! We know this because we have seen how much you have overcome and accomplished this school year. We are SO proud of you! We know how hard you have been working to learn new things this year in school. We hope that you know that we believe in you and in your ability to show the world what an incredible kid you are! There are some things we want you to know before you begin testing.

First off, TerraNova does not assess all of what makes each of you exceptional and unique. The people who created and score these tests do not know each of you the way we do, and certainly not the way your families do. They do not know that some of you speak different languages or that you love to sing or draw. They do not see your natural talent in various sports. They do not know that your friends count on you to be there for them when they need a good laugh or that your smile can brighten someone's day. They do not know about the activities you participate in outside of school or that sometimes you help with your little siblings at home or what you wish about for your future. They do not know that you are INNOVATIVE, EXPRESSIVE, and THOUGHTFUL and that you give your best every day!

The scores you will get from these tests will tell you something, but they will not tell you everything. There are many ways of being smart. You ARE smart! You ARE enough! You are the light that brightens OUR day! So while you are preparing for these tests and in the midst of it all, remember that there is no way to "test" all of the AMAZING and AWESOME things that make you, YOU!

The most important thing to remember while you are taking these tests is for you to take your time and do your very best because in the end, that is all that matters! We are asking that you give your best effort and to show off how much you have grown and learned this year! One last thing, we are always here to support you because WE LOVE YOU!"

TERRA NOVA TESTING: Students in grades 3-8 will have Terra Nova testing on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday of this week. There will be NO ASSEMBLY in the gym on Tuesday

and Thursday. Testing will take place from 7:50 - 9:30 each day. Second grade will also be taking a practice test during these times. **Students in grades 2-8** <u>will not be allowed to check-in during the testing times.</u> Please make sure you allow extra time to get to school. In order to help your child be at their best for testing, please make sure they get adequate sleep and eat a breakfast with protein.
